The reason Kirsty is stepping back from such an important role is to take on board an even more onerous one – that of Presbytery Clerk in the new Presbytery of the South West of Scotland.

As we seek a replacement Clerk Russell Wyllie has agreed to be Session Clerk pro tem."

"During the summer, the congregation, further to its vote to change constitution, has now received this new Constitution.

The most obvious change is that there will now not be any Congregational Board; instead matters of finance and fabric will be dealt with by separate committees who will report directly to the Kirk Session.

The Kirk Session has also formed two other committees, one dealing with areas of church mission and the other handling pastoral care concerns.

May God continue to be with us all as we move forward together as a congregation.

This report is based on figures up to 31st July 2022

Total receipts to date: 38,159.46 total expenditure to date: 53,442.06 deficit 15,282.60

I know this paints a bleak picture financially and I hope you are not too disheartened by it as there is so much more we can offer by way of our talents and our time as well as our giving.

We still have Gift Aid to claim and there has been a couple of larger expenses throughout the year so far. A dishwasher was purchased for the church halls at a cost of £2326 + electrical work.

Streaming equipment totalled £6,221 which was paid for by separate donations.

The Holy Fair teas raised an amazing total of £1,948.43 and our thanks go to all who helped and contributed on the day.

This year we are having our annual Giving Day on Saturday 24th September 2022 from 10-12 in the church halls.

Tea, coffee and home baking will be served and a warm welcome will be extended to everyone.

Once again I would like to thank everyone who contributes on a regular basis and for this I, as treasurer am very grateful.

AUTUMN RECIPE:

If you are looking for a slice of something nice, you won't go far wrong with the recipe below.

-BAKI

topping

Wholemeal Chocolate Cake

100g (40z) wholemeal flour
50g (20z) drinking chocolate
2 teaspoons baking powder

150g (60z) butter
100g (40z) dark brown sugar
2 tablespoons honey
3 (size 3) eggs
3 tablespoons milk
140ml (4 pint) double cream
1 tablespoon lemon juice
1 large banana, mashed

Oven temperature: 180°C/350°F/No. 4

Position in oven: Centre
Time in oven: 35 minutes

75g (3oz) plain or milk chocolate

Method

1. Grease and line two 18cm (7 inch) cake tins.

2. Cream butter, sugar and honey then beat in eggs one at a time.

- 3. Fold in flour mixture then blend in milk.
- 4. Divide mixture between the two tins.
- 5. Bake until well risen and firm to touch. Cool.
- **6.** Whip cream and fold through banana and lemon juice. Sandwich cake together with cream.
- **7.** Melt chocolate and smooth over top of cake. Allow chocolate to set before serving.
