Prior to this, we in Scotland were able to share our own time with her as she lay within St Giles Cathedral in Edinburgh. The reign of Elizabeth has been remarkable for all

For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved." (Rom 10)

Yes, we believe that the Queen has entered eternity, now one of the multitude of believers who hears God say, 'Well done, good and faithful servant! ...Come and share your master's happiness!'(Matthew 25)

We give God thanks for the life of Queen Elizabeth, and we pray for Charles as he ascends now to the throne, hopeful that he will follow the wonderful example his mother has set for him.
