#### From the Minister - Rev Dr Allan Vint

It is the time of year when, in Scotland and around the world, much is spoken about the great Scottish bard Robert Burns. Of course, here in Mauchline there is perhaps greater attention given to him and his works since it was in these parts for many years he lived and matured in his gifting.

Besides being a local resident Burns was also a member of the church and subject to the good and bad of its time. As someone who paid close attention to the Bible (he knew it well), the church (being aware of its strengths and of its weaknesses) and of course church people (he was also keenly acquaint with human faults and failings - often from personal experience!) - meaning he had much to say about each.

In Christian beliefs Robert Burns was a moderate, aligning himself with the 'New Licht' outlook of some contemporary Church ministers. Those who took a more conservative, approach became the subject of some harsh words from the poet. For example, Robert expressed his dissatisfaction writing to a local minister (a New Licht) called Rev John McMath.

None of us is perfect, this much is very true – the poet knew it in himself and was well able to highlight his own weaknesses and doubts.

O Thou, who in the heavens does dwell, Who, as it pleases best Thysel', Sends ane to heaven an' ten to hell, A' for Thy glory, And no for ony gude or ill They've done afore Thee!

I bless and praise Thy matchless might, When thousands Thou hast left in night, That I am here afore Thy sight, For gifts an' grace A burning and a shining light To a' this place.

The man in life, wherever plac'd Hath happiness in store Who walks not in the wicked's way Nor learns their guilty lore!

He did however take exception to those who

were hypocritical – putting on a display of piety and goodness whilst clearly being flawed in so many aspects of their life and attitude. Famously in 'Holy Willie's Prayer he pokes fun at such as these.

Robert Burns does us a favour by shining such a strong light on such things because it forces us all to take stock of our own life. What do I believe and why? Am I authentic and true or am I hypocritical? We might also ponder, like the poet, our

own mortality and where we might be eternally destined. certainly caused Burn to once pray

O, aid me with Thy help, Omnipotence Divine!

#### **Treasurer report January 2024**

Total receipts Jan – December 2023 £88,106
Total expenditure Jan – December 2023 £71,313
Surplus Jan – December 2023 £16,793

The Church Ceilidh brought in £532 - it was a great night as well as raising funds for the church. Thanks to everyone involved.

Our Christmas Eve service raised £213 for our chosen charities this year, which were The Red Cross and Children's Epilepsy Scotland. Thanks to all who gave to these worthwhile causes.

The final accounts for the year 2023 are currently being prepared so the figures above may alter slightly once everything is confirmed.

The surplus includes some one-off donations and a £10,000 legacy which have helped with finances this year. However going forward, this income is not guaranteed so income may be reduced in the coming year.

Our Energy contracts expired recently and the new rates are higher than previously (as is the case with everyone). Therefore our electricity and gas costs have increased in the last part of 2023 and into 2024.

Once again I would like to thank everyone who contributes on a regular basis and for this I, as treasurer, am very grateful.
