From the Minister - Rev Dr Allan Vint

In my thinking, I often reflect on the past to help my understanding of the present and the prospects for the future. History is a great teacher, not only of what has happened previously, but also of the lessons we need to learn.

In recent weeks, it was a great privilege to be involved in the unveiling of a memorial in Sorn to two individuals involved in the story of covenanting – Rev Alexander Peden and George Wood. Today there are many forces at work in our society who do not want our children to know the Christian story. Of course, it is a story rich in teaching values and ethics, along with the essential principles of living a good, productive and agreeable



life. This is not to mention the pointers it gives to receive the inner strength, guidance and hope that so many today crave. So, what might be the outcome of a society where Christian principles and actions are left behind? A more selfish way of being? A society where everyone makes up their own rules for what is right and good? A society where politicians determine what is ethical and where the boundaries of right and wrong exist? Sadly, we are beginning to see this reality begin to emerge.

It also stands as witness to what happens when we stop looking after what we have — when what is there is just let go. Some have suggested that we are now in an era of a Post Christian society — where the once treasured things of church and faith are in the process of being ignored and forgotten (certainly fewer young adults know much about the Bible and its contents and a great number of adults never 'darken the door of the church').

I want to take this opportunity as we move out of the cold and dark of winter into the new life of Spring to consider how we might truly value our Christian heritage and how we might, with renewed determination, hold fast to the truths passed down the
