#### <u>From the Minister – Rev Dr Allan Vint</u>

The image on the right is a coloured stone carving that I observed high up on a building in St. Andrews. We were visiting this charming university town on holiday, and it was fascinating to be reminded, through such imagery, of the historic events that shaped not only this place but all of Scotland.

At the bottom of the carving, we can see a representation of St. Andrew, positioned according to his method of execution, which was to be bound to an X-shaped cross. Andrew remained there for two days, preaching to those who passed by about the risen Lord Jesus.

Andrew, of course, had known Jesus personally. He had witnessed firsthand His miracles, heard His teachings, and, most importantly, had seen Jesus die and then experienced the risen Christ three days later. Andrew couldn't remain silent about such profound events; he wanted others to know and to be convinced to become followers of Jesus.



The authorities, however, had different intentions. The Roman proconsul in Patras, Greece, demanded that Andrew cease spreading the Christian message and instead make sacrifices to the Roman gods. Andrew refused, declaring his allegiance to Jesus Christ and condemning the worship of idols as false. It was this defiance that led to his arrest and eventual crucifixion. His steadfast faith and refusal to renounce Christianity were the primary reasons for his execution.



There was a time when Scotland was known for the spirit of Andrew—people whose Christian faith was unwavering and whose allegiance to the Christian cause and the Church was second to none. Scotland was celebrated for its ministers and missionaries, as well as for the determination of its people to honour Christ.

Today, I believe we need to rediscover our Christian roots and heritage and once again place the cross at the heart of our civic society. So as we travel through

this period called Lent towards the events of Good Friday and Easter Sunday let us be inspired by Andrew of old and reflect the sense of words of the hymn writer Isaac Watts

1 I'm not ashamed to own my Lord, or to defend his cause, maintain the honour of his Word, the glory of his cross.

2 Jesus, my God! I know his name, his name is all my trust; nor will he put my soul to shame, nor let my hope be lost.

3 Firm as his throne his promise stands, and he can well secure what I've committed to his hands 'til the decisive hour.

4 Then will he own my worthless name before his Father's face, and in the new Jerusalem appoint my soul a place.
